A few moments with Don Danforth III, President and Co-Founder of City Academy

City Academy graduates are thriving in some of the area’s most competitive secondary schools, and our first graduates are now attending college. Isn’t this part of the initial vision that you’ve had from the beginning for City Academy?

We have always believed that there are so many bright kids who need opportunities, and that if we provide those opportunities at an early age, the benefits will last a lifetime. Suddenly, the things we dreamed about are really happening! We see our students becoming leaders and enjoying new challenges for all of the right reasons—because they are smart, confident and hard-working.

What is it about City Academy that people find so compelling?

When they visit City Academy, people are pleasantly surprised by everything—the look of the building, the academic rigor, and especially how engaged and appreciative the students are. You can tell from talking to the students that they understand they are in a special place. It’s easy to get caught up in the excitement.

Why do you think so many City Academy graduates stay in touch, and come back to the school?

For many of our students, we are an extension of their family. During their eight years here, our students and their parents spend more time here than they do any other place. Coming back to City Academy is like coming back home.

A Clear Understanding

Principal Kelly Tyson explains the demands and rewards of City Academy

With more than five applicants for every student opening, it is clear that parents want what City Academy offers. What should prospective families understand before enrolling their children?

Our mission at City Academy is to provide a rigorous independent school education. In order for a student to experience success in an academically challenging environment, there has to be a consistently strong partnership between home and school. Thus, our program is specifically designed for highly-motivated and serious students and families who commit to hard work on a daily basis. Being an independent school parent is not easy, but it is truly rewarding!

Independent schools have a lot of freedoms that other schools do not. What does this mean at City Academy?

At City Academy, we make decisions that are in the best interest of the child. On a daily basis, we ask ourselves, 'What is the best way to reach this particular child? How can the teacher design lessons that meet the child's needs?' We have the freedom to address the unique needs of our students in immediate ways that are exciting, and proving successful.

Isn't City Academy's shift from the traditional homeroom model to our specialist model a perfect example of how we can adapt our approach to instruction to fit the students' needs?

Yes! In most elementary schools in the U.S., the homeroom teacher is expected to be a generalist. At City Academy, we have embraced the specialist model, which is more of an international approach to teaching. Through the specialist model, our highly trained teachers instruct the one subject about which they are most knowledgeable. Their passion for the subject allows for dynamic individualized lessons each and every day. Imagine being 10 years old and learning math from an aeronautical engineer, learning science from a biologist, or literature from a former Shakespearean actor! Our students do not need to imagine it because they have the privilege of living it on a daily basis.

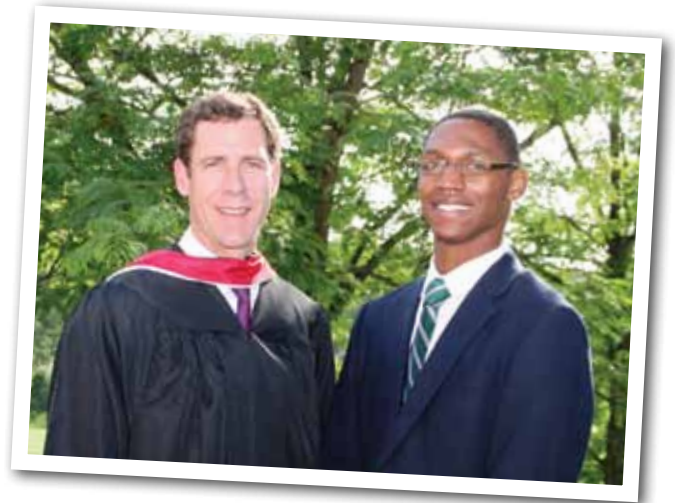


Looking back

City Academy graduates reflect on what they've learned

Just a few weeks before his own graduation from Whitfield School, City Academy graduate Reybren Fitch came back to campus to address the school's largest-ever class of graduating sixth graders at the Annual Luncheon. Reybren, who had just accepted a full-tuition scholarship to Vanderbilt University's School of Engineering, offered this advice to the students who were about to leave City Academy for their new secondary schools:

"You will soon see a whole new world...as you venture on, you will see open doors leading to new pathways everywhere you look...Enjoy every minute of this new world and take advantage of every opportunity that comes by...preparation makes all the difference."

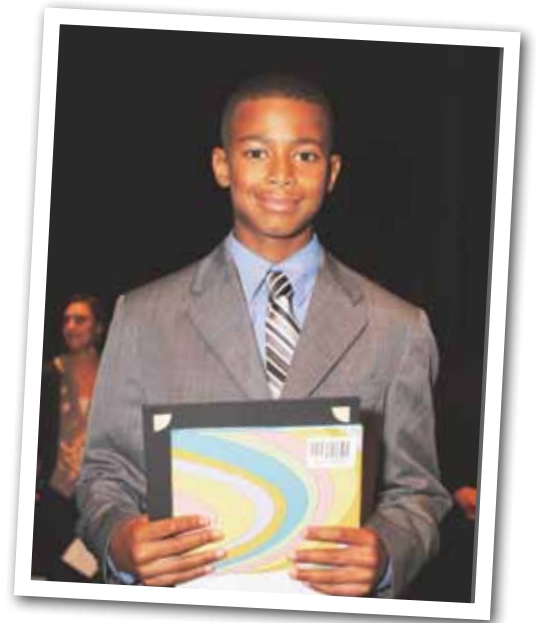

"I have attended City Academy for eight years and have grown up in a community that has nurtured my mind, body and soul...we have been asked to do more than simply memorize a new vocabulary list or take notes on what various ecosystems look like. We have been asked to think and reason our way through math word problems...in literature class, we have been constantly tested not only on whether or not we can keep up with a story's plot, but also on whether or not we can apply the story's moral to our own approach to life. Succeeding in this type of school has given me the opportunity to practice doing exceptional work as opposed to work that is simply acceptable."

And Moving Forward

Marshall's classmate, Mark Wheeler also took the opportunity to share his appreciation during graduation. He used the lyrics from the song, 'Tomorrow,' by Tevin Campbell, to make his own interpretation of the future.

"Tomorrow is the day to make up for the mistakes or outdo the successes you made the day before ... Because of all of the 'tomorrows' I have had at City Academy, I have learned some really great things. The most important of these is the idea that learning is a process ... As I get ready for spending new 'tomorrows' at Whitfield School next fall, I am so thankful that I have had the support and encouragement of my mom and this community to get me from one day to the next. Your commitment has really made a difference in my life."

Colby Elliott, a freshman majoring in Fashion Communications at Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri, was in City Academy's first class of sixth grade graduates in 2005. This class is our first to graduate from high school and attend college. Six of the nine graduates have received full-tuition scholarships.

Rolling up the sleeves

Mary Schoolman says she's the luckiest member of the City Academy Board of Trustees.

By rolling up her sleeves and getting involved on the alumni committee, Mary has come away with a valuable insight that confirms her commitment to the school all the more.

"City Academy keeps in touch with every single graduate after they move on. The school offers guidance not only with placement, but also research on financial assistance and even college preparation," she says. "I've never heard of anything like this! This really sets the school apart."

Mary had the opportunity to get to know City Academy graduates during a group service project preparing meals for distribution at the Jewish Food Pantry.

"As we were cooking, the students were organized and hard-working, but what really impressed me was the knowledge these kids had about Judaism, much of which they had learned through humanities classes at City Academy. They were actually teaching me some things!"

Philanthropy at an early age

As a fourth grader at MICDS, Jack Hays was impressed when he visited City Academy with his mother, Margaret, but he noticed something was missing: Kindles for the students to use in the library.

"I use my Kindle a lot and I really like to read," says Jack. "I started thinking that maybe there was a way I could help raise the money for some of the kids at City Academy to have Kindles."

By launching The Kindle Project, Jack raised more than \$3,000 selling old books, lemonade and washing cars. City Academy now has 20 Kindles, which are used every day by students in the library.

Getting hooked and bringing others along

Dana Townsend finds the best way to translate her excitement about the school is by bringing people to campus for Buddy Morning, an event that consistently melts hearts and forges bonds between members of the community and students.

"Buddy Morning is just a great way to help people understand how special City Academy is," says Dana, who brings her colleagues from Enterprise to campus twice a year for the event.

"I think having a passion for something, finding something you really believe in and giving your time, is as important as making a donation," she says.

Doing *what you can, when you can*

"We do what we can, when we can," says City Academy Board member Megan Frank, describing the philosophy that she and her husband, Chris, share.

The Franks own **Cfx**, a full-service advertising agency in St. Louis, and both are active volunteering their time and expertise to a few select organizations.

"I could see right away that City Academy's students are well-rounded, and that they are going to be contributors to the community one day," says Megan.

Megan heads up the marketing committee and regularly lends her expertise to projects at the school. She has helped develop a new City Academy logo and branding, created a new, fresh look for the alumni wall and attends school events on a regular basis, often with someone new in tow, including her two daughters.

"One of the reasons we do what we do is that we want our daughters to see us give our time," says Megan. "We want to set an example for them that this is how to live."

Giving time

When Scott Duncan started volunteering four to five hours a week at City Academy last year, his reasons for making the trip were clear—three students who needed help with reading.

“I was able to watch one young man transform from a reluctant reader into a voracious reader by the end of the year,” says Scott, who has since increased his volunteer time at the school to twelve hours, helping fifteen students with math.

“I’ve never taught math before, and I certainly didn’t know much about the Singapore method, but I’ve read all of the school’s textbooks, so I can work with the students in a way that’s consistent with what they are learning in class,” he says.

A teacher and former trial lawyer, Scott explains his commitment to the school. “I come to the school because these kids are smart and because they need direction at an early age. City Academy is opening a big door for its students and their families, and I like being a part of that.”

Sharing talent

Volunteer Jean Wolff started coming to the school last year, too. A retired reading specialist, she gives her time to City Academy for two simple reasons.

“I like being with kids and I feel like I still have something to offer,” she says, talking fondly of the three students with whom she works on a regular basis. “Each student has different needs, and I’ve learned that if one approach doesn’t work, something else will. To me, teaching is an art. You have to be creative. I believe that if I can reach even one student in a positive way, I’ve done a good job.”

For a new perspective

Connecting across generations

City Academy took intergenerational programming to a whole new level last year, bringing its bright sixth graders and those of an older generation together to breathe life into a history lesson about the Civil Rights Movement.

The result was “The Experiences That Shaped Us,” an original documentary created and produced by the students who gathered their information not from a textbook, but from more than 20 individuals who were willing to share their eyewitness accounts of the Movement as it unfolded in St. Louis.

“I salute City Academy for inviting us to the classroom,” Norman Seay told a reporter from the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*.

Student Lailah Elliott had the opportunity to interview Freeman Bosley, Sr., a longtime alderman and father of the first black mayor of St. Louis. She told the *Post-Dispatch*, “He said the first thing we need to do is get an education and that should be our first priority. He told us that if you see something wrong, don’t just sit there. Speak up.”

The final version of the documentary was featured during a special screening at the Missouri History Museum in June, 2011.

David Jones is one of the many who said "yes." A development consultant, he is credited with coming up with the name for the school, and remains involved as an advisor and board member.

"People volunteer when they feel committed to an idea they want to help advance. For me and many others, that idea is helping Don fulfill his vision of providing children from educationally underserved parts of our city with as good an education as is offered at the best independent, public, or parochial schools in our region. Each visit to City Academy provides more evidence of the growing number of benefits being received by its students, families, and our broader community. It just keeps getting better and better, and that's a big part of why I keep volunteering my time."

And from the Heart

Results that Satisfy

Longtime City Academy friend Bob Virgil agreed to get involved during the start-up years because he admired the commitment to excellence. Thirteen years later, he is still involved because the results are so exciting.

“We’re all thrilled when we go to the school and see what the students are achieving,” he says. “This school is demonstrating that you can achieve the highest quality in education anywhere, under very challenging circumstances, if you have the commitment required to make it happen. We need more of these kinds of examples in St. Louis.”

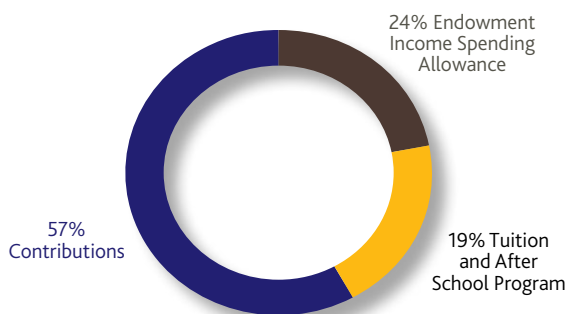

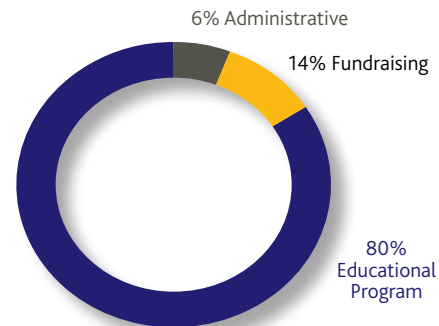
